Site

Amelia Island is a beautiful barrier island of white sand beaches, oak forests and natural beauty. Located in North Florida, 30 minutes from Jacksonville International Airport, Amelia Island is a gateway to the nation's oldest city, St. Augustine, the Space Coast and Orlando area attractions.

Course Description
